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Our YEAP! project

The economic crisis and its impact on the labour market have put a large number of young Europeans at risk of social exclusion. Since 2011, twothirds of EU countries recorded an increase in long-term youth unemployment for those aged 25-29. The largest increases were registered in Greece (+86.8%) and Cyprus (+313.6%.)

Encouraging entrepreneurship is particularly important as part of the approach needed to tackle these alarmingly high youth unemployment rates in most of the EU Member States. For many years, the development of the entrepreneurial capacity of European citizens and organisations has been one of the key EU policy goals. This situation has called for and brought together project partners from across Europe to design, develop and implement "Youth Entrepreneurship Advanced Pathway" (YEAP!).

The YEAP! project aspires not only to contribute to shaping the mind-sets of young people but also to provide knowledge, skills and competences that are crucial to the development of an entrepreneurial culture. It aspires to do so through an innovative, individualised learning pathway.

How does the YEAP! project achieve its goals?

By implementing innovative activities that foster the development and assessment of entrepreneurial skills promoted by using them every day.



By developing new approaches to strengthen education and training pathways for prospective young entrepreneurs

By promoting the engagement of youth workers.

Intellectual Output 3. Youth Workers' Toolbox

The aim of this output is to enhance the quality of youth work and to professionalise youth workers by improving their knowledge and competences through a specially designed toolbox.

The Toolbox will contain a comprehensive set of learning tools and checklists developed for coaching entrepreneurs and students, which will:

support individuals and teams to learn key venturing skills

provide a scalable struc-

ture for 'intrapreneurship', smart camps and workshops, to stimulate lean innovation

provide a practical guide to complement entrepreneurship lectures

support teams to progress on their own between live piloting sessions.

Real world scenarios and cases of start-up companies

Topic-specific learning tools (e.g., group exercises, role playing, simulation, videos) explaining the issues that entrepreneurs need to address and how to do so

Intellectual Output 4. Business Idea Assessment Guide

The purpose of the Business Idea Assessment Guide is to:

Develop a framework to assess the business ideas for future youth enterprises

Test this framework in the specific case of the YEAP! Project's youth enterprises and, in the longer run, validate it

Use the assessment Guide as a monitoring tool This will help young entrepreneurs to decide if they can turn their idea into a business, empower them into believing in themselves and the feasibility of their business idea and ultimately reinforce commitment and sustainability.

Intellectual Output 5. Youth & Social Entrepreneurship e-tools for Business Start-up Database

This will be a database that facilitates the writing of business plans, allowing each young person to fill in their own elements and the specifics of their business projects.

More specifically, the following e-tools will be developed:

SWOT analysis e-tool. This will help young entrepreneurs to form their business ideas, as they will be able to identify their Strengths, Weaknesses, Opportunities and Threats.

Cash Flow analysis etool. This helps participants to estimate in detail the projected cash receipts and cash paid out arising from their business ideas. These tools are intended to support the first steps that are necessary before developing the Business Plan and will help young entrepreneurs to "evaluate" in realistic terms the feasibility of their business idea.
